A force majeure hit Parker Lord on Sunday, February 9 when a massive fire broke out and nearly destroyed Lord Corporation's Saegertown, PA facility. The facility is now out of commission and Lord will not be shipping any of their Chemlok rubber-to-substrate bonding adhesives for at least six months. Nearly all rubber roller manufacturers use these bonding materials in order to adhere elastomers to various metal cores, so this is a major disruption to our industry.

We feel for Lord and especially for the six firefighters as well as the seven Lord employees who were injured in the blaze. While we are concerned about Lord's viability in the near future, our industry must continue to manufacture. It is at times like this when the industry connections we have forged over the years ride to the rescue. At Rol-Tec, we immediately collaborated with the people we met through the International Roller Manufacturers Association (formerly RRG) for suggestions, names, and contacts to help us bridge the gap. Fellow roller companies shared information, rubber suppliers pointed us in the right direction, and equipment manufacturers sent unsolicited emails with suggestions.

We are now on firm footing with a secondary source of supply and stand ready to continue to serve our customers' needs.

You never join a trade organization with bridging a disaster in mind as the motivation. Most look to trade organizations as a source to improve industry knowledge, meet new supplier representatives, find the latest equipment, or just gather with industry peers once each year. All are true and worthwhile pursuits. This time, however, our IRMA / RRG network fostered over the years and buttressed through many RRG meetings, came through to keep us producing. The IRMA / RRG connections helped us weather the storm.

I encourage you to continue your support of IRMA not only through your membership dues but by attending our annual meetings. 




Porous Drilling Machine




